RE: SEA QUEST Testing

Dear Bob,

After using many phosphate products since 1997 that were supposed to stop rust problems and build-up of deposits in our system we were considering discontinuing use of phosphates completely after seeing almost no positive results. It was decided that we would try one more product that was guaranteed to do what we wanted it to. Sea Quest was tried at two of our pumping stations and there was a definite reduction in red water calls and build up in piping at the stations.

We decided to test Sea Quest throughout our system. We dug up a four inch line that has been in our system since before using any phosphate products; we cut out a two foot section of this line and found it to be nearly completely built up with deposits to a flow of about an inch. We put the section of pipe back in service for a period of one year then dug it up found a definite reduction of the build-up in the pipe. I was surprised by the results and decided to put it back in service for another year. I am eager to see how much more will be removed.

As for the red water calls they have become few and far between. When our fire departments would do monthly flow tests throughout the system we would get red water calls, since using Sea Quest, the calls have stopped. This has reduced our overtime calls and water loss due to customer complaints.

It was good to find a phosphate product that could stand up to its claims!
